## H.O.P.E. Grant – Application Detail

The goal of H.O.P.E.'s grant program is to enable supplementary financial support to Heyworth Elementary staff for the end benefit of student education/enrichment. 1. Describe the proposed need/project/program and the objectives it would accomplish.

I would like to do clay projects with First through Sixth Grades at the end of the school year (this year). There is no kiln at the Grade school; so that means that I have to purchase the, often times more expensive, air dry clay if I want the student to have experience with it. I only had enough room in my budget to purchase clay for the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Grades this year. The money from the Grant would go towards purchasing clay for the other grade levels (1<sup>st</sup> – 4<sup>th</sup>). Each grade level “traveled” to a different region of the world in Art this year. They learn about the geography, culture, history, artists, and art of that particular region. Their art projects are based on the places they travel. The clay projects that I would like to do with the students would also be based on the region they are in. However, all grade levels would learn different versions of the same techniques (based on their ages and experience). Students would become familiarized with a common clay vocabulary from a young age, and this knowledge would carry through every year in art.

2. What is the estimated cost of the project/program? Please summarize and attach itemized list.

\$200.60 would be the total cost of 5, \$40.12 class packs of Model Magic (a paintable, air dry clay). There would be enough clay here for every student in 1<sup>st</sup> – 3<sup>rd</sup> grades to have one package of clay and for the 4<sup>th</sup> graders to get 1 ½ packages.

3. Who and how many would benefit from this project/program? What would be the impact on students/staff?

Every student in 1<sup>st</sup> through 4<sup>th</sup> grades would benefit from this project. Clay is always a favorite among the students, and they beg to do a clay project every year! We study and look at pictures of ceramics and clay sculptures all the time, but seeing and doing are two totally different things. I would love for the students to get hands on experience with the actual material. We would learn new vocabulary words, art history, artists, and techniques by working with clay. The students would also be able to use painting skills they acquired this year to paint their finished sculptures.

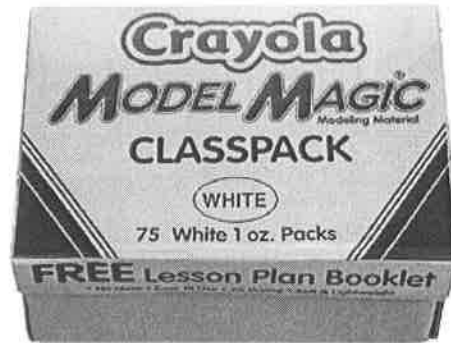
