We would like for each student to paint a canvas painting which would then be up for sale the night of the auction. Miss Brooks will work with the students on the paintings during art class. The materials needed surpass her budget, so we would like to use a grant to purchase the materials. All of the profits would of course be donated back to HOPE.

These would also be available to parents to purchase after the Hoedown as well, for parents and families who are unable to attend. Another idea is parents may also make a donation for pictures that aren't purchased to be displayed in the art room or the classroom for the remainder of the school year.

3. Who and how many would benefit from this project/program? What would be the impact on students/staff?

The entire school would benefit, as the money raised would go into the proceeds raised from the Hoedown. This is about \$1.50 spent per 2nd grader. If the paintings are sold at \$10 each, this has the potential to make around \$700 profit that will go into the Hoedown fund to benefit the students and school.
