During this unit, it is my goal to provide my students with high-engaging materials and instruction in order to increase interest and promote an enjoyment of poetry. In order to reach this goal, I will need the appropriate materials. As of now, my poetry book collection is small and does not include books that are often highly enjoyed by children (i.e. Shel Silverstein's work). I hope that by building my poetry collection with popular children's poetry books, I will be able to promote a love of poetry for my current students as well as future students.
